




NAYARA TENTED CAMP

COSTA RICA

The glamping trend shows no signs of waning, and one of the most spectacular new options is located in northern Costa Rica's rain forest. Sharing 62 acres with its sister properties, Nayara Gardens and Nayara Springs, Nayara Tented Camp features 21 tents on a hill facing the Arenal Volcano. The tents keep nature front and center, with dual indoor and outdoor showerheads and jungle-inspired wallpaper, plus verandas with infinity pools that draw water from hot springs. Between relaxing in the six thermal rock pools and nibbling on ceviche, guests can take walks with a naturalist to spot the red-eyed tree frogs, toucans, and sloths that live among the guarumo trees. *From \$1,200.*
